Rich of their past experience, the designers are keen to approach the future with the evolution of the studio's identity, embodied by a new logo even more representative of their common vision of design.

Two of their latest projects are of particular interest. The first one, the full refurbishment and livery of a Gulfstream G450 will be unveiled at EBACE while the other is a green Bombardier Global 7500 set for delivery early next year (Q12024)

## Ramp appeal

The G450 aircraft is set to be delivered from its Swiss completion center just in time to be showcased on Static display during EBACE. For this project, the two designers collaborated closely with the owners of SCK AVIATION to propose a unique design that could be completed within the lead-time of just three and a half months.

The team's dedication to their craft ensured that both the interior and exterior were completed to the highest standard, delivering an exceptional result for the client.

The extreme and radical design of this G450, sleek, sophisticated and one-of-a-kind, gives the aircraft a strong identity, emblematic of the private aviation full-service offered by SCK AVIATION.

With its unique matte black paint and glossy black lines, the aircraft creates a dynamic appearance that reflects the surrounding environment.

The structured seats with geometric lines are upholstered in flannel and black nubuck. The entire cabin features a dark anthracite grey tone with matte and glossy materials. This special matte paint matches the effect of zinc oxide. It complements the glossy black paint of the aft bulkhead, which reflects the whole perspective of the cabin thus amplifying the feeling of visual space.

The ultra-soft anthracite look of the window panels and ceiling creates a sharp contrast with the shiny effect of the valence.

The galley and entrance area finished with a wood grain pattern and satin matte look, while the 'portoro' silver marble used for the countertops in the galley and AFT lavatory adds a touch of elegance. The owners selected a stunning carpet with silk highlights.

M&R Associates Design managed the completion of the G450, ensuring that the project was completed in the record time of 15 weeks and with exceptional guality. The expertise of Jet Aviation in Basel, F/List, and General Atomic were instrumental in bringing the studio design vision.
